



The director is performing a role in our December production of "Deckchairs" and will need to schedule initial rehearsals around that commitment, including some rehearsals from 7-9pm whilst that season is running.

Post Horn Gallop is an old fashioned fast paced farce. Snobbish Lady Elrood has opened the castle to tourists in order to make ends meet, assisted by heritage guide, Miss Partridge. Their daughter arrives with her wimpy husband who is being pursued by gangsters. Fifty boy scouts set up camp on the front lawn with their Scout Leader, George, while tourists, Bert and Maggie are charged admission by everyone who meets them. Add balmy Lord Elrood who shoots everyone on sight, stolen paintings, secret passages and an amorous maid, for total chaos.
