PLAY #1



ART, by Yasmina Reza, translated by Christopher Hampton, tells the story of three men who are forced to re-evaluate their friendship after one of them buys a large painting of fine white diagonal lines against a white background for the exorbitant price of 200,000 francs. It is a humorous yet heartbreaking story that examines the meaning of art and friendship. Directed by Suzanne Matulich and starring Shane Mallory, Lee Gerchow and Callum Campbell, with artistic advice from Lorraine Kitching, this production only has three

performances and they are all at the Ipswich Art Gallery.

Opening night of ART is Sunday 29 April and is a fundraiser for the Ipswich Arts Foundation. Tickets, for the play and refreshments, are available by phoning Sue Evans on 3810 7223.

Public performances are on Monday 30 April and Tuesday 1 May—doors open at 7.00 pm for a 7.30 pm start with tickets only available at the door each night.

Ticket prices are \$15 and \$12 concession and ILT members. This is the first time that Ipswich Little Theatre has performed on the Ipswich Art Gallery stage since relocating their base to the Incinerator Theatre. Previously the stage was part of the old Ipswich Town Hall where Ipswich Little Theatre began.

ILT is presenting this play as a special feature of the 2007 Ipswich Festival.

Getting to Know.... Jane Sheppard— actor and director

- Q: How long have you been involved with Ipswich Little Theatre?
- A: My wonderful introduction to ILT in 1973 was a role in "Clearway", directed by lan Pullar. This was a very bold production for that time, about young people gathering together under the bridge of a new bypass road. We even had a publicity photo shoot outside Donny Paske's motorbike shop in Brisbane Street the photo of Robin Keller and I perched on the motorbike is a treasured memento. After the performances we would all head off for supper and dancing at the "Bakehouse Steakhouse".
- Q: What is your very favourite play, not necessarily one produced by ILT?
- A: A trip to Sydney to see "The Lion King" would have to rate as the most fabulous theatre experience the costuming, puppetry, acting, music, lighting and special effects were superb.

- Q: Tell us about your worst experience in the theatre.
- A: My most difficult experience in the theatre was in 1981 performing in a drama I really don't know how I made it through each scene before dashing up the steep backstage staircase to succumb to the severe nausea of early pregnancy. The show must go on!!!
- Q: Is there a play which you would love to see produced in Ipswich?
- A: A major strength of ILT is that we have directors and actors with diverse styles, which provides an interesting mix of plays for our yearly programme, and I enjoy seeing these varied productions.

Finally, what would I spend an unexpected cash windfall on?

After appeasing our bank manager, a house on a headland overlooking the beach would be attractive personally. And for the theatre? funds to pay a "producer" to oversee all the other aspects of staging a play so the "director" only needs to think about the actual performance aspects.

Auditions will be held on 1 May in the Jean Pratt Building at 7.30 p.m. for the two plays *Anzac Day* and *D-Day* to be presented in a short season in August under the collective title *One Day After Another* directed by Helen and Ian Pullar. Rehearsal period late July/ August.

Anzac Day (a series of monologues) is set in rural Queensland in 1954.

Cast: 1Male aged 69 and three Females aged 60, 33 and 16.

D-Day, the action of which revolves around a British airman

shot down prior to the allied invasion of Normandy in 1944.

Cast: 2 Males aged 73 and early 20s an four Females aged 69, 49, 30-50 and early 20s.
