## **Getting to Know....** Liz Boekholt, sound and lighting and nickname of 'God'

- Q: How long have you been involved with Ipswich Little Theatre?
- A: I think I've been a member for about 10 years now, but most of it's a blur.
- Q: What is your very favourite play, not necessarily one produced by ILT?
- A: I'm still very fond of Harvey Fierstein's "Torch Song Tril ogy". It's a poignant re minder of how we're all look ing for that special person and the agonies we endure to find and hold on to them.
- Q: Tell us about your worst experience in the theatre.
- A: I was Stage Manager for my first experience at ILT and our leading man had been burn ing the candle at both ends, he was exhausted. He had always been word perfect in his performance but on this night he started out on shaky ground and got steadily and rapidly worse. About half way through the first act he'd had

enough and decided that the only way to cope was to flee. Only that the director and I were standing at the backstage door and caught him prevented him from skipping off completely. We literally pushed him back on stage to his bewildered fellow cast members. The play continued and finished about 20 mins short of normal time. That was when we found out that the critics were in the audience. Fortunately for me this was my first experience at the theatre and i thought that this was probably normal. Who knew.

- Q: Is there a play which you would love to see produced in Ipswich?
- A: I'd still like to see Torch
  Song produced. I think
  Ipswich would benefit by
  seeing how the characters
  want the same things and
  feel the same way as "the
  rest of us".

- Q: If you won a large amount of money what would be the first thing you would spend some of it on?
- Q: I would love to do London's East End and New York's Broadway and Greece to see the beginnings of theatre.

Liz is also the coordinator of the Smartarts group which offers drama training to the junior thespian wannabes.
