
Auditions for David Tristram's sex, drugs & rick'n'noel will be held in the Jean Pratt building on Monday 31 March, 2008 at 7.30pm

Arts and Culture in Australian Life -A Statistical Snapshot

This publication provides a snapshot of the latest key cultural statistics, including Australians working, participating and volunteering in the arts and cultural sector, Indigenous arts and culture, Australian spending on arts and culture, Government funding and the impact of the sector on our economy.

Figures provided by the National Centre for Culture and Recreation Statistics, Australian Bureau of Statistics include data from the recent releases of the ABS, Work in Selected Culture and Leisure Activities, April 2007 and Employment in Culture, 2006.

Some key highlights show

that as many as 3.5 million Australians work in our culture and leisure sector and that Australians of all ages actively support arts and culture, with 85 per cent of Australians attending at least one cultural venue or event in a year.

Other highlights from the publication include:

- Australia exported over \$534 million worth of cultural goods in the last financial year;
- 27 per cent of Indigenous adults participate in creative arts;
- Australian households spend \$14.7 billion on culture per annum; and

Australian Governments spend \$5.5 billion on cultural funding per annum.

This information came from Cultural Data Online.

Cultural Data Online is the website of the Cultural Ministers Councils Statistics Working Group. It provides statistics on arts and culture in Australia and has a number of cultural research reports. Copies of publications and pamphlets are available for download free-of-charge at www.culturaldata.gov.au.
