55th Festival & Fabulous 40th Celebrations

What an amazing month Ipswich Little Theatre has just experienced.

First of all, we welcomed over 100 cast and crew members to our **55th One Act Play Festival** over the weekend of 7, 8, 9 August. An amazing array of 19 plays were presented over 5 sessions offering everything from farce to serious drama. What a feast.

The winners are on page 3 and a full list including those shortlisted for awards is available on our website.

Then, without drawing breath, we launched ourselves into a whirlwind of activity to celebrate the enormous milestone of **40 years in our much loved Incinerator Theatre.**

Saturday 15 August was the date for our **formal Cocktail Party** with distinguished guests from the three levels of government, representatives of other local cultural groups, past ILT members and other special people.

An illuminated interpretative panel in the Courtyard was unveiled with much pomp and ceremony and will remain as a permanent fixture allowing all visitors access to information about the conversion from city incinera-

tor to cultural icon.

Saturday 22 August was a major event encompassing an Open Day from 10am to 4pm. There was a full program of performances, in both the Incinerator and the Jean Pratt Building, from all the groups within Ipswich Little Theatre as well as

some very welcome guest performers from the Cambrian Youth Choir, Ipswich Musical Theatre Company and the Ipswich Orpheus Chorale. Add to this some popular Historic Theatre Tours, arts workshops and demonstrations and a busy kitchen and bar and you get a good idea of just what a dynamic day it was.

To top off these successes, Saturday night was **Party Time!** Highlights included the launch of *Burning Brightly* the sequel to *Rising from the Ashes*, the first history of our theatre society. This has been a labour of love for Helen Pullar and is a vital record of all the activity at our theatre from 1996 to 2009. It is available for purchase for only \$20 and if you don't have a copy of *Rising from the Ashes*, it has been reprinted and is only \$15.

A very special celebration of the commitment to ILT by our current **President**, **Judy Grant** came in the form of her being made a **Life Member of ILT**. Di Johnston created a powerpoint overview of all of Judy's theatre involvement and it was an emotional moment when she was given the respected Life Member badge.

To complete the formalities, a **DVD** consisting of interviews with many ILT members was viewed and launched.

Then it was the 'largest cast party of all time' as approximately 100 people celebrated that pivotal conversion 40 years ago of the heritage building into a community theatre

Auditions: on Tuesday 1 September at 7.30pm in the Jean Pratt Building auditions will be held for the last play in the 2009 program.

The play is Forget Me Knot by David Tristram and will be directed by Jan Paterson with Desley Cronon as assistant direc-

The performance season runs from 25 November to 12 December.
