30 July - 13 September

VALE ZILLAH NORRAK

Tributes flowed at the funeral of Zillah Norrak who died at 91 years young on 16 April. Zillah, and her husband Lou, were regular members of the small audiences which attended our plays in the Town Hall in the 1960's in the dark days of live theatre following the advent of television. They continued to be loyal and enthusiastic followers for many years after our move to the Incinerator in 1969 and delighted in Ipswich Little Theatre's growth and success in our unique and historic home.

Zillah's home was a treasure trove and first call for some ILT directors. If a prop or piece of furniture was required she would generously loan it (sometimes for months) once she had found it under a pile of books and papers.

She received an OAM for her Contribution to the Community in 1991.
