Our President Reports on Activities

We had a dream – and over two weeks that dream was realised as we celebrated our achievements over the past 40 years.

The driving force behind these celebrations was Helen Pullar. Any of you who have worked with Helen know and appreciate the great deal of energy, both physical and emotional, that she puts into anything she does. Match this with her love for our theatre company – its people and its home and add lan, the other half of the 'Pullar equation' and the sky is the limit. We were all up there flying with them on Saturday evening as we celebrated with the largest cast party that we have ever thrown!

Our celebrations commenced at the Ipswich Art Gallery on 30 July with the opening of our display of photographs, programs and newspaper clippings which celebrate 40 years of performance at the Incinerator Theatre. The display occupies part of the old Town Hall stage, which was our performance venue for the 23 years before our move to the Incinerator. During August our Smart Arts, Crossfyre, S-Troupe, Daytime and Tourific Trouper sub-groups have returned for performances on the Old Town Hall stage and have entertained visitors to the gallery.

On Saturday evening, 15 August, guests gathered, in their finest attire for our 'hoity toity' evening where an Interpretative Panel, detailing

through text and sketches, the history of our home and our society, was unveiled by the mayor, Councillor Paul Pisasale. Invited guests on that evening included local councillors and local state and federal members of parliament, two foundation members of ILT. Nan Scott and Yvonne Hawkins, life members, administrative committee members, past presidents, architects and builders who have worked on projects in out theatre precinct, members of community cultural groups and members, past and present, who have given significant service to the society. Andrew Spark, Mieke den Otter, Margaret Cook, and Ivan McDonald, the team of professionals responsible for the creation of the panel, were also present.

As President of Ipswich Little Theatre Society Inc, I was honoured to present our people and our home to significant community representatives. Equally I graciously accepted, on behalf of the society, the bouquets we received on the evening. As a follow up to the evening, Mr. Shayne Neumann MP Federal member for the seat of Blair, spoke in the House of Representatives, of our contribution to the community and to preserving the Walter Burley Griffin Incinerator. On Saturday, 22 August we opened the gates of our theatre precinct to the Ipswich and wider community and invited them to celebrate with us.

All of our sub-groups were involved in a variety of performances in both the Jean Pratt building and the Incinerator Theatre and historic tours of the complex were also conducted. Our final celebrations were held that evening. Over 120 past members, current members, loyal audience members and supporters and their partners joined us for a trip down memory lane. Many others sent their apologies and said they were very disappointed that they could not join us. Tributes were paid to our members; Helen launched her book, Burning Brightly, which is a sequel to Rising from the Ashes, our theatre video premiered; the magnificent birthday cake was unveiled and much drinking, eating and reminiscing was done throughout the evening.
