On 1 & 2 June 1973 the Ipswich Little Theatre Young Theatricals first performed officially as a group. There were 3 plays on offer - *Little Women* (Act1) directed by Eleanor Beale, *Ride a Tiger* directed by Judy Payne and *Miss Tarzan* directed by Colin Payne. The YTs have had good years and bad years since then. The good years have been when they had a director, the bad years when they didn't. But in anyone's language 40 years is a marvellous achievement. Over the years the YTs have provided us with members to our senior group and in the last few years this has been very evident. To celebrate the founding of the YTs it is planned to hold a reunion in the Jean Pratt Building on Saturday 1 September from about 2pm. We are hoping to have programs, photos, some film footage and a lot of old familiar faces for you to catch up with. The current YTs have a couple of short plays and a couple of original not so Young Theatricals might be coerced into performing. We are hoping that some past members and directors can be called upon to share some of their memories and thoughts. This event is open to all current and past theatre members because everyone at YTs recognises that without the support of the Theatre members there would never have been YTs. The details still have to be finalised and more information will be available next month.

#### Festivals in the 'Olden Days'

Having moved into the Incinerator in 1969, we held our Festival there in 1970. However with no Jean Pratt Building, the space was far too cramped. Beryl Johnston arranged with the Ipswich Girls' Grammar School for us to hold our Festival in the school hall, which we did for more than 25 years.

The hall was poorly equipped with only four spotlights mounted on the ceiling and a very primitive dimmer. We took our own lights, set them and draped cables (including a three phase connection) all through the hall (ask Ron Sheppard about these delights!) This did improve over time, thanks to the Trustees and us.

It was also our policy to provide furniture for all the competitors. We borrowed the McPherson & Beale fruit truck (pkf Clive Beale) and carted every conceivable table, chair, bed etc and stacked them to the ceiling in the wings. We could barely move. And the day after the Festival we had to pull it all out! No wonder we were exhausted!
