For years Dr Edward Sarclett has been scoffed at for his progressive and unorthodox experiments in surgery. When the sensitive young poet, Stephen Cass, loses his hands in a climbing accident, Sarclett performs a miraculous operation successfully grafting the hands of a dead man to the poet's wrists.

Sarclett at last gains the recognition he deserves. However, the poet finds himself moved by strange and unfamiliar memories as well as sinister impulses. There is a foreboding sense of impending horror when he feels himself drawn towards Abbie Sarclett, the surgeon's daughter. Abigail, too, suspects her love for the young poet contains some strange hidden meaning. *"Perhaps the most chilling love story you'll ever see."*

From the President

It is very encouraging to see ILT functioning well with four plays successfully cast – two main house plays and two festival plays.

It is interesting to note that for all main house plays, there are approximately as few as 6 or as many as 12 cast and crew involved in each production.

To support those members, there need to be 78 Front of House and Bar positions filled to ensure that each production runs efficiently and to a professional level.

Admittedly, that number is made up of many people who volunteer more than once and some as many as 13 times. Also supporting each production are the set builders, graphic designers, selection committee and the publicity and promotion team.

This highlights the fact that we need all our members to be active in supporting the theatre program to avoid the situation which often occurs where members are at the theatre sometimes as many as 6 nights each week.

If you know of any members who are not participating perhaps a gentle encouragement might be rewarding. If each member worked three shifts Front of House each year the burden on the others would be greatly relieved.

I would like to congratulate the cast of *Stepping Out*, Jan, Desley and other crew members on a very successful first week which had some audience members almost in tears with laughter. It is very heartwarming to be able to put the SOLD OUT sign on our website. A great start to 2012!


