It wasn't just a few good men who auditioned for Shane Mallory's production on 25 March—it was a large number of very good men!

will be presented in the Incinerator from 10 to 27 July.

Lieutenant Daniel Caffey is a brash Navy lawyer who is charged with defending two Marines accused of killing a fellow soldier in a military hazing incident allegedly known as a 'Code Red'. These Marines, Caffey and others involved in this case, are confronted with complex issues of loyalty and honour, dealing with the Marines most sacred code and the Corps most formidable warrior, Colonel Nathan R Jessop. Haunted by his own demons and his famous father, Caffey journeys with these Marines towards a fate that is life changing for all involved.

We recently received some very sad news. Peter Sherry of Logan Players has passed away. Members will remember Peter and his wife Judith as regular players on the Festival circuit.

### Festival 2013

Wonderful news for this year's Festival (our 59th). Jennifer Flowers has agreed to be our adjudicator.

Jennifer is an actor /director who has worked for all the major Australian theatre companies. She has received four Matilda Awards for excellence in acting and directing in Queensland and in 2006 was nominated for the National Helpmann Awards for her performance as Sister Aloysius for the Sydney Theatre Company production of *Doubt*. In 2005 she was awarded a Churchill fellowship which enabled her to travel to London and New York to observe internationally renowned teachers of voice and text. She has also served as a member of the Board of the Queensland Theatre Company and peer assessed grant applications for Arts Queensland. She was also the very first director of David Williamson's Amigos, recently produced by ILT. Her production in 2004 was with the Sydney Theatre Company and performed in the Sydney Opera House.

We are very fortunate to have obtained her services.
