Raising the Roof

Members will be aware of our concerns over the problems in our courtyard during inclement weather. As a temporary solution, we purchased the portable cover which has served its purpose reasonable well, but was badly damaged during the last weather event and will have to be replaced.

We have been working towards a permanent solution that will give us weather protection, warmth in Winter and coolness in Summer. Our architect Andrew Solomon (the man who designed our wonderful Jean Pratt annexe), has been working on plans for a roof.

Recently Building Committee members and Andrew met with the Council's Heritage Adviser Ivan Macdonald and our Council Liaison Officer Brian Watkins to discuss progress with our planning. Their reaction was extremely favourable, so work will now continue towards plans of sufficient detail to obtain an approximate estimate of cost. This will be followed by all the applications for necessary approvals and finance.

The Committee is extremely excited about Andrew's wonderful concept.
