The Big Cats directed by Craig Taylor is a gentle play told with warmth and tenderness about an elderly couple, Lily and Joe, who have spent all of their married life in a two-up, two-down council house. Their lives are shattered when they receive a letter from the council notifying them that their house is to be demolished and that they are to be rehoused.

Making a welcome return to the Incinerator stage in this play are Les Chappell and Jan Paterson who are reprising the roles they played with great success in 1990. Sharing the stage with them is accomplished actress, Karen Peart.

Pier Twelve, written by Queensland playwright Ron Kelly and directed by Phil McCormack, showcases Pip Prole, a product of Young Theatricals, and Theatre stalwart, Tony Erhardt.

The play is set on a remote section of waterfront, where a desperate young woman is helped by a kind and religious stranger who sets out to redeem her soul.

With tickets at \$12, theatre loving audiences can enjoy the ambience of the courtyard of the unique and historic Burley Griffin Incinerator and be entertained by talented local performers in two thought-provoking and poignant plays.
