Festival 2014

This year will be a huge event as we will be celebrating our 60th consecutive Festival. Ipswich hosted the very first such Festival in Queensland with the opening night — 19 July 1955 — a very special occasion indeed. To commemorate the event an Invitation Only Cocktail Party will be held on 19 July 2014 in the Art Gallery (old Town Hall) in partnership with Ipswich City Council, while a gala birthday party will take place the following weekend — 26 July. More details will be provided later.

The Festival itself will be held on 8, 9, 10 August. For a change this year, the Youth Section competition will be held during morning and afternoon sessions on Saturday 9 August with adjudication following that afternoon.

As part of the celebrations a DVD is being prepared to be shown on 26 July and subsequently. Sub-Committee members Helen Pullar, Craig Taylor, Robyn Flashman, Jan Paterson and Ian Pullar are working very hard to contact contributors and trawl through archival records to compile a valuable memento of this great achievement.
