Two New Life Members

On Friday 13 February, around 40 members gathered at the Incinerator to farewell our long-serving Lighting and Sound Director, Phil Holmes, who is returning to England. It came as quite a surprise to him to be awarded Life Membership. Suzanne Matulich was equally surprised at receiving the same award. Congratulations to both these very deserving recipients.

Phil joined Ipswich Little Theatre in 1988 and immediately became heavily involved in lighting and sound. Over the next five years he lit something like 17 major productions and several of the Juniors. He then returned to his native England.

Fortunately, he came back to us in 2002. Since then he has designed and set the lights for virtually every main-house and sub-group performance and all the Festivals – an enormous number of shows – and personally operated lights and sound for many of them. For many of these, such as *Scenes from a Separation, Time and Time Again, The 39 Steps* and *A Few Good Men*, he developed intricate complex effects, the like of which we have seldom seen, using cutting-edge computer technology.

In addition to this, he has been entirely responsible for the acquisition, installation and maintenance of all our equipment. We couldn't have managed without him and he will be sorely missed as he returns again to England.

Suzanne Matulich – all-rounder.

In 1974, Suzanne (then Sue Cook) appeared in ILT's production of *Rookery Nook*. She returned in 1984 to play Peter Pan in the Daytimers' production, and over the next few years appeared in two major productions and three one-acters, and directed several Junior productions as well as two major productions and a one-acter.

She set up her independent group Crossfyre Youth Theatre, with productions entered regularly in our Festival. After 15 years, she amalgamated this group with Young Theatricals, directing a number of challenging productions.

Her major productions include *Wolf Lullaby*, *President Wilson in Paris*, *Art*, *Enter a Free Man*, *Scenes from a Separation* and *Amigos*. She has also had success with a number of One Act plays in Festivals and seasons.

For nine years, from 2006 to 2014, Suzanne was Director of our prestigious Annual Drama Festival and can be credited with much of its continued success.

In November 2011, having been Vice-President for two years, she was elected President, holding the office for two years. She is now a member of the Ipswith Little Theatre Society Presents

Executive as Past President.

A reminder that the next auditions to be held will be on Monday, 23 February for our two festival plays.

"Snowangel" by Lewis Carlino, will be directed by Phil McCormack, assisted by Tony Erhardt.

The play is about a whore who wants to sleep, a client she sets out to service and his very real needs that she is not prepared to satisfy.

At once confronting and full of confusion and misplaced emotion, the play requires a cast of a male 45 to 60 years old and a female 45 to 55 years old.

"For Whom The Southern Belle Tolls" by Christopher Durang, to be directed by Jan Paterson, assisted by Desley Cronon.

In this parody of *The Glass Menagerie*, the fading southern belle, Amanda, tries to prepare her hyper-sensitive, hypochondriacal son, Lawrence, for the "feminine caller". Terrified of people, Lawrence plays with his collection of glass cocktail stirrers. Ginny, the feminine caller, is hard of hearing and overbearingly friendly. Brother Tom want to go to the movies, where he keeps meeting sailors who need to be put up in his room. Amanda tries to face everything with "charm and vivacity", but sometimes she just wants to hit someone.....
