# Developments at the Theatre

Last year ILT received a very generous donation of a photocopier through Tony Erhardt. This was installed in the original kitchen area in the Jean Pratt Building, but the existing bench was deemed too high by certain vertically challenged members who requested a lower bench. This inevitably led to a major refurbishment of the old kitchen area as a lighting/sound control area. New benches and cabinets have been constructed and installed by Ian Pullar and Billy Lowe, and Ron Sheppard has moved the entire patchboard down from the loft to this area for ease of operation. We also took the opportunity to dispose of an accumulation of junk!

In the next bit of time it is planned to replace the temporary staging in the "tunnel" with a more permanent, squeakless construction. This will, however, be capable of relatively easily dismantling for directors who require more headroom behind the normal back wall – particularly to cater for very tall actors who would otherwise have to duck!

We also plan to put a ceiling above the lighting control area in the loft-it has only taken us 45 years to get around to doing this.

A number of new flats will also be constructed to make set building easier.
