Full Steam Ahead with Our Roof



toral Office, we applied for a grant from the Blair Stronger Communities Fund. Not only did we never receive an acknowledgement of our application or a request for more details in the advertised second phase, we received NO MONEY at all. What else are we supposed to do?

We have entertained Ipswich audiences for 70 years; we have trained hundreds of young people in theatre crafts; we have catered for people with disabilities; we have helped numerous community groups to raise valuable funds; we have entertained tour groups from other cities; and we have saved, maintained and developed the iconic Burley Griffin Incinerator of which the city is extremely proud, almost entirely from our own resources. We cannot understand why we missed out. We have been told we can apply to a second round of funding, but we will be ineligible as our project will be FINISHED!

Working Bee


