

Milestone for Junior Theatre

It was in 1967 – 50 years ago – that Ipswich Little Theatre decided that the youth of the city needed a Junior Theatre and took steps towards creating one. The new group officially started the following year, taking schoolchildren of all ages. Kevin Hallewell was the first Director.

In 1973, Young Theatricals was created to cater for 14 -1 8 year olds, with Junior members being primary school age.

Junior Theatre has not functioned every year since 1968 because it has sometimes not been possible to find a Director.

Nevertheless, such a long history is a credit to the many who have undertaken the Directorship – and to the hundreds of students who have passed through the ranks.
