

The students also enjoyed their attendance at the final rehearsal of *The Sum of Us* where they asked searching questions.


The Mayoral By-Election

There will be no need for anyone to leave the Incinerator for food. Breakfast will be available on both Saturday and Sunday morning, dinner on Friday and Saturday evenings, as well as lunch on Saturday. And the traditional Sunday barbecue will still be featured. And the bar will be open!

S-Troupe

Students are now working on our October production "A Man for all Seasons". The show will include some time lapse projections which students are acting out. It is also hoped there will be some live music in the show. Currently Director Di Johnston is sourcing costumes and making heaps of props etc .

Tourific Troupers

This year, 2017, is the tenth year of Tourific Troupers. Although we had been hosting and feeding tour groups for some years, we decided in 2007 that it would be good to remind groups that they had visited a theatre, not a restaurant. So we developed a suite of ten minute plays which we added to our menu and formed the Tourific Troupers.

By the end of this, our tenth, year, we will have hosted 141 tour groups and presented two seasons of ten minute plays. Thirty different plays will have been presented for a total of 310 performances. 22 players will have performed for the tour groups and a further 22 have appeared during the two seasons.

At an average profit of at least \$500 per tour, this means we have added more than \$70,000 to the Theatre's bank balance. In addition, we have attracted a large number of new customers for our mainhouse productions.

This of course would not have been possible without the score of helpers who provide the catering workforce, many of whom are supporters rather than members.
