

Our organisation is now so complex that there is no one person who can know at any given time what other members are doing. On any given day people may be found at the Theatre undertaking necessary tasks to keep the wheels turning. Nothing will change this, but what is becoming increasingly apparent is the amount of activity which is now required by the 'big brothers' out there just to allow us to function.

Gone are the days when all we had to worry about was the next performance. For example, we recently had to undertake a compliance audit for our Blue Card system. The latter has been faithfully and accurately main-tained internally for years but now it has to be backed up by written documentation involving sign on and off policies, transport policies, dressing room procedures, mental health awareness procedures – the list goes on and on.

As Vice President, Ann Collyer undertook to fulfil the requirements and was able to enlist the help of her daughter who had previous knowledge of these stringent requirements. This took hours. It is not an isolated incident – just the most recent.

The 64^{th} Annual One Act Play Festival will be held in a fortnight (10 – 12 August) and we need your help. The festival this year is just about as big as it can get without taking up another day.

Here is a brief rundown of the weekend:

On Friday 10 August starting at 7pm there will be 7 Ten Minute Plays. At the conclusion of the Ten Minute Plays we will also present Ipswich Little Theatre's Open entry – "Two's Company, Five's a Chorus". After a short break while the Adjudicator deliberates, we will present the Ten Minute Play Awards.

Bright and early at 8am on Saturday morning we will have the first 6 Youth Plays. After Lunch there will be another 5 Youth Plays and the Youth Play Awards will be held after that.

Saturday Night will see 4 more Open Plays. Sunday morning and afternoon will see another 7 Open Plays. After that we will have the final Award presentations and our traditional farewell supper.

Of course everyone will be well fed and refreshed by our wonderful Courtyard Bar and Kitchen. Don't forget that Sunday lunch will be the iconic ILT Festival Barbeque, traditionally the time when we get a chance to catch up with once-a-year visitors.
