



Vale Mary Ryan

The Queensland Times recently included in its Death Notices the passing on 21 June in Box Hill, Victoria, of Mary Ryan at the age of 87.

This name will be unfamiliar to most of our current members, but Mary and her husband Walter were very involved in Ipswich Little Theatre in the 1960s. Wally (as he was usually known) appeared in numerous plays including *Boeing Boeing*. He, along with Ian Pullar and Clive Beale, was one of our representatives on the Ipswich Cultural Centre Committee which was responsible for the conversion of the Incinerator. Walter was elected President in December 1971, but had to resign within a few weeks when he won a job as a radio announcer in Melbourne.

The Ryan family, including their five children, relocated to Melbourne. In due course diabetic Walter died, but Mary became Mayor of Box Hill. She came "home" to help us celebrate 40 years in the Incinerator.

But Mary is particularly important for a major component of our well-being. As a member of St Mary's parish she suggested that it could be mutually beneficial for them to make a group booking of an entire evening at our theatre. Thus began our group bookings which have been so successful. We must be ever-grateful to Mary (and Walter).
