Members are reminded that the Annual General Meeting will be held in the Incinerator

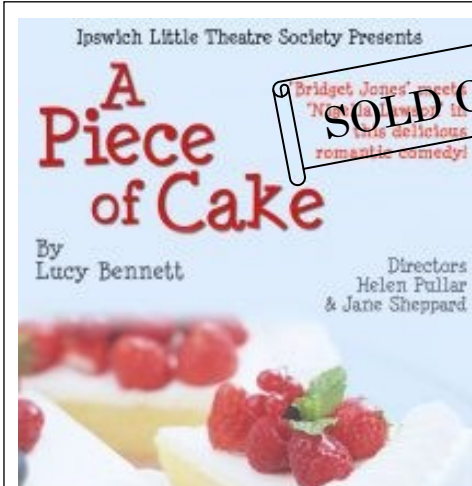
**at 3 pm on Sunday 9 December**

We also plan to reroof the JP pergola with insulated roofing to make it cooler for waiting audiences.



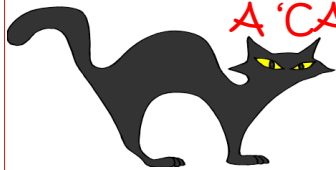
## Junior Theatre & Little Players
