


"Tickets sales are going gang-

From the Administrative Committee

Our newsletter keeps readers up to date with what all our performing members are doing, but we also need to be aware of the body of work happening behind the scenes. Recently, Expressions of Interest were called for 50 positions for 2019, 48 of which have been filled by 34 different members, most of whom also serve on the Administrative Committee, with some also on Building Committee and Selection Committee.

A standard Admin meeting can table 36 reports as well as General Business—we are a complex company. Members have recently devoted time to updating the Position Descriptions for the responsibilities they undertake which have to be sufficiently detailed that anyone could take over at a moment's notice.

It is not by accident that ILT runs smoothly—it is the result of hard work and dedication from committed office bearers who give both performers and patrons the best possible outcomes.

Performance Opportunity

A communication from Janet Findlay informs us that she and Alan Youngson (former manager of Logan Entertainment Centre) will be presenting a production of *Viagra Falls* by Jay Hartley at Studio 188 late February/early March 2019. Ipswich Civic Centre will be helping them with promotion, publicity resources and contacts.

They will be holding a preliminary reading of the script on 28 October at the Woodend Nature Centre from 1pm to 4pm, and open auditions at Studio 188 on 10 November from 1pm to 4pm. These will be advertised in local media shortly.

Review of Sleuth

Peter Penne of *Stage Whispers* reviewed our production. Here is an extract from his article:

Callum Campbell played the pompous and self-important Wyke with a cunning deviousness; a man who relishes the play and one-upmanship of the win and one who was determined to succeed. As his foe, Aaron Watson was a well-matched Milo, giving as much as he got then slyly turning the tables as he sought revenge. His second-act turn as the local plod was hilarious, complete with Groucho Marx glasses and nose and a regional accent. Together they were a formidable couple as they played out Shaffer's bizarre games on an appropriately cluttered set that included a stained-glass window, tiffany lamp and life-size teddy bear.

Les Chappell's direction kept it moving at a steady clip helped by Tony Erhardt's spot on lighting and sound.
