

COVID-19 virus

We are closely monitoring the advice from the Australian Government Department of Health and Queensland Health. We are also following the suggested approach of Live Performance Australia and other industry bodies at this time. Based on their current advice, all planned performances now and into the foreseeable future will be going ahead in the Incinerator Theatre and the Jean Pratt Building. Both venues seat fewer than 100 patrons.

This means that tickets will go on sale for 'Waiting for God' on Monday morning 16 March 2020 at 9.00am.

We are aware that this is a rapidly developing situation and will update this advice if our schedule is required to change. Should patrons feel at all unwell or develop symptoms, we would recommend that they follow the health guidelines to self-isolate and stay at
