


nel" a real challenge!

Work in Progress

As soon as *Breaker Morant* finished, a team comprising Chris, Jim, Di, Robyn H and Ian moved in and stripped all the stage curtaining in preparation for the sanding of the multiple paint layers on the stage. The curtains were vacuumed and brushed ready to be rehung. All the seats from the auditorium have been relocated and the lights bagged to protect them from dust.

Work has also been carried out on the entrance to the Jean Pratt Building with the removal and replacement of the broken garden edges. On a day when the weather forecast was for a cloudy

day with a temperature of 27° , Chris and Ian laid new garden edges under bright sun as the temperature soared to 37° .

Chris has subsequently been replanting along the edges to complement the gardens which are so widely admired by all visitors to the site.
