PLAY Bookings have now opened for our first season of 2022

The Games People Play.

The season comprises two plays *Golf, Marriage and Other Murderous Matters* by Debra Chalmers, directed by Aaron Evans

and *Murder Play* by Brian J Burton, directed by Ann Collyer. Despite all the restrictions due to COVID, both plays are well advanced with their rehearsals. The set was constructed on 16 January as can be seen from the photograph. So *The 39 Steps* finally comes to the end, being overpainted for the next



season.

Since the cast returned from the Christmas break, they have followed Covid guidelines to ensure everyone has been safe. They even had a cast member, Georgie, the lead in *Golf*, spend two rehearsals on zoom while the rest of the cast were in the theatre due to her being a close contact. Fortunately, both her tests were negative!

Bookings promise to be heavy with 25% booked on the day the box office opened.

LED There Be Light

Thanks to a subsidy from the Blair Electoral Office and a generous loan from President Jim, we were able to upgrade all the theatre lights in the Incinerator to LED lamps. This will improve our lighting and, because of energy efficiency, be cheaper to run and produce less heat. Many thanks to Phil Holmes and his offsider Tony Erhardt who installed them. This has also led to improvements in the Jean Pratt Building lighting.



It is hoped that an additional grant from the Blair Electoral Office will also allow us to install ground lighting from the front gate to both performance venues.

Sub-Groups Girding their Loins

All the sub-groups have developed their plans for 2022 as follows:

Junior Theatre will meet as usual on Saturday mornings during school terms. They will present two shows this year – 17 & 18 June (three performances) and 3 December (two performances). **Little Players** to be advised.

Young Theatricals will meet on Wednesdays from 5 to 7 pm. They will present a showcase of their work to parents and friends on 4 June (to be confirmed). A production will be mounted on 9, 10, 16, 17 September.

Daytime Theatre Troupe will meet on Wednesday mornings. During Book Week, 16 August to 2 September they plan a pantomime with performances to match demand. A Christmas pantomime will also be presented between 24 October and 11 November.

Tourific Troupers performances will depend on how manageable the COVID compliance rules are.

There will also be a **Directors Master Class Weekend** on 11 and 12 June.

And after the **Festival** having to be cancelled for the last two years, it will be back on 12, 13, 14 August.

ALeak

On Wednesday 5 January I was painting in the Jean Pratt Annexe when the heavens opened. Then Phil Holmes, who has been finishing the installation of the LEDs, arrived to tell me there had been a serious leak with water pouring into the Wendy House over the expensive light controller. We guessed rain must have blown up under the roof tiles and we would need to find a solution.

The next day it didn't rain, but Phil reported another leak. Because it was so hot and humid he had again turned on the air conditioning. The pipe that removed the condensate from the air con had ruptured at a bend over the Wendy House, spewing water over the plywood ceiling.

Fortunately Phil was able to dry out the equipment so there was no permanent damage. We called in the air con technician from Mansol who very obligingly rerouted the offending pipe. He reported the downpipe into which this had discharged was choked with leaves. An appeal to the Council brought a plumber next day who cleared this downpipe and the gutters. So it was a happy ending, but a real worry for a while.
