A good time was had by all.



## Auditions for Breaker Morant

Auditions will be held on 8 August for our final production of 2022-Breaker Morant, by Kenneth G Ross.

During the Boer War in South Africa in 1901, three Australian 'irregular' soldiers are tried by a British military court for the murder of 12 prisoners and a German missionary. The accused are Lieutenants Harry Morant, Peter Handcock and George Witton. Morant, an English-born adventurer who has spent years in Australia, maintains he was following the unwritten orders from Lord Kitchener to "kill all prisoners". However, the killing of the German Missionary may push the Germans to side with the Boers. The trial thus becomes a trial of politics and not a trial of truth.

Director David Austin and Assistant Director Aaron Evans require a cast of 11 men to take on the following parts:

- LT. HARRY MORANT: Aristocratic manner yet lacking in drawing room poise. Good looking, strong, almost arrogant in manners. A contradiction of a man, a poet yet pragmatic; reckless yet suspicious; frivolous yet solemn.
- LT PETER HANDCOCK: Tough; the roughness of an Australian bushman about him. Handle-bar waxed moustache. About the same age as Lt Morant.

LT GEORGE WITTON: Large man, several years younger than Lieuts. Morant and Handcock.

- MAJOR THOMAS: Fresh boyish face, preferably not older than thirty. In the beginning seems to lack confidence, but piece by piece he gathers strength and assurance. He is soon seen to be much shrewder and alert than at first suspected. However, in contrast to the prosecuting officer, he is not urbane and remains the country 'bush' solicitor, fighting for fellow Australians whose innocence he earnestly believes in.
- MAJOR BOLTON: A middle-class English solicitor, poised and polished, who has reservations about taking the case, but fights vigorously to win throughout the court martial.
- PRESIDENT OF THE COURT: LT COLONEL DENNY: An Englishman in his mid-fifties. Used to exercising military authority.
- MR ROBERTSON/ MR VAN ROOYAN. Mr Robertson: A failure, shows symptoms of alcoholism. Hollow featured, shows nervous subordinate manner in front of Lord Kitchener. Aged about forty-five. Mr Van Rooyan: A bearded Dutch farmer.
- SERGEANT-MAJOR DRUMMITT/CORPORAL SHARP:,Sgt Mj Drummitt: Stiff parade-ground manner. Cpl Sharp: A Cockney soldier.
- TROOPER BOTHA: Timid manner. A Dutchman in the British army.
- DR JOHNSON/ORDERLY Dr. Johnson: A dour Scot approaching sixty. There is a civilian's contempt for the court martial as he sees himself as a preserver of life unlike the military he must deal with.
- CORPORAL TAYLOR: Forceful, almost aggressive, crisp military manner. Displays a lot of nervous energy while being cross-examined by the prosecuting officer.
