# Vernon Cornish

ILT, as you all know, hosts the longest running Drama Festival in Australia. The first Festival, held in 1955, was the brain child of Vernon Cornish who was a member at that time. Vernon joined the clergy and left Ipswich, serving in a number of parishes and in a number of roles including Dean of St George's Cathedral in Perth. He was appointed Bishop of Hobart, but on the day of his scheduled inauguration, suffered a fatal heart attack.

We were contacted recently by Christine Ledger who is the author of a biography of Vernon, *Who Is This Vernon Cornish?*. She and her husband were in Ipswich visiting her sister and brother in law and asked to meet with someone from ILT and view the Incinerator. Ian Pullar met with this foursome and after a tour of the premises, Christine presented him with a copy of the book and a book of Vernon's selected sermons and other writings. His involvement in ILT is only a minor part of the biography which deals mostly with his ministry. I will place both books in the library.

On 24 May we hosted a tour by the Millennium Probus Club of Kenmore. I was approached by one of the visitors who asked, "Did you know John Cuffe?' I readily admitted that I did indeed know John Cuffe, "Well, I'm his brother Bob," he said. "That would explain why you look like him," said I.

John Cuffe appeared in a couple of plays for us in the Town Hall and then in the Incinerator. He played a King of France in one of my Birthday Parties (1972). His most notable performance was in The Rape of the Belt. (1973). He played Zeus and Liz Robinson played Hera. They sat on opposite sides of the proscenium delivering commentary on the action of the play. At least they did except on the night when John fell asleep. Liz furtively tried to arouse him from across the void but coughs and whispers proved to be to no avail. So she rendered the silence with, "John, wake up!", much to the amusement of the audience.
