12 Angry Jurors

Our third major production for 2023 will be 12 Angry Jurors by Reginald Rose adapted by Sherman L Sergel directed by Aaron Evans and Assistant Director Dave Dunkerley.

In a hot New York jury room, 12 jurors are deliberating in a capital murder case of an 18-year-old African American boy, charged with the stabbing death of his father. If a guilty verdict is reached, it will be an automatic death sentence. The case appears to be open-and-shut to eleven of the jurors. However, Juror No. 8 casts a 'not guilty' vote.

Auditions for this drama will be held on **Monday 5 June**. Potential auditionees may like to consider their preferred roles from the descriptions below. There is no specification of age or gender – all that is required are "twelve good men (or women) and true."

Juror 1 - Foreman: A small-minded and petty person who tries to keep order in the jury room but is quickly overpowered by the other jurors.

Juror 2 - A meek, timid person who lacks the confidence to form their own opinions.

Juror 3 - A hot-tempered and opinionated person who has a personal vendetta and is determined for the vote of guilty.

Juror 4 - A wealthy, educated person who is analytical and logical in their thinking, but sometimes lacks empathy.

Juror 5 - Quiet and reserved person who comes from a disadvantaged background.

Juror 6 - Painter: A hardworking and practical worker who values honesty and integrity above all else.

Juror 7 - A brash, self-centred jokester who is more concerned with his own personal gain than with the case.

Juror 8 - A thoughtful and principled person. They use calm form of debating to look at the facts of the case. Juror 9 - A wise, observant elderly person who has a keen eye.

Juror 10 - Bigot: A narrow-minded and prejudiced person who makes racist comments and is quick to judge the defendant based on his background.

Juror 11 - European immigrant: A thoughtful and respectful person who is proud and values the principles of the American justice system.

Juror 12 - A flashy and superficial person who works in advertising. They are more concerned with their own image and reputation.

Safety

For the past few years we have again been watching the growth that occurs in our chimneys. This has been a perennial problem and on several occasions, the Council has undertaken works to remove trees from the central chimney. Council has now agreed to take action to remove a tree from the northern chimney which appears to have displaced a brick, and a large number of ferns from the central chimney.



We have also voiced concerns about the danger at the junction of Burley Griffin Drive and Griffith

Road where cars have been permitted to park very close to the Drive, thus make exiting hazardous. Members should soon notice yellow lines painted by the Council on Griffiths Road making it illegal to park where the visibility for exiting drivers is greatly impeded.
