Break a Leg

The traditional good luck message for actors is "Break a Leg" but what is its origin? One source suggests that it stems from the superstition that malevolent forces are ever-present and apparently wishing evil will cause those forces to turn their attention elsewhere. The principle is that if you wish evil, good will come.

The expression may relate to the 1865 assassination of Abraham Lincoln in Ford's Theatre in Washington DC. Actor John Wilkes Booth, having shot the President, leaped onto the stage, breaking his leg in the process.

A third possible explanation dates from times where the audience sat on individual wooden chairs. It was hoped that the comedy actors would cause so much laughter that the chair legs would be broken.



12 Angry Jurors

Our third major production for 2023 will be 12 Angry Jurors by Reginald Rose adapted by Sherman L Sergel, directed by Aaron Evans and Assistant Director Dave Dunkerley.

In a hot New York jury room, 12 jurors are deliberating in a

capital murder case of an 18-year-old African American boy, charged with the stabbing death of his father. If a guilty verdict is reached, it will be an automatic death sentence. The case appears to be open-and-shut to eleven of the jurors. However, Juror No. 8 casts a 'not guilty' vote.
