Important Positions Vacant — Can you help?

Some Ipswich Little Theatre members undertake a huge amount of work, other than directing and performing. Believe it or not, there are more than 50 jobs with titles which are all filled annually through Expressions of Interest. The vast majority are undertaken by members of the Admin Committee who are currently running on overload. This year, the Committee is seeking <u>additional volunteers</u> to undertake a number of important roles.

Box Office Manager. This position was created by Shane Mallory as part of his ICT role and he has been its only incumbent. It is now time for someone else to take over — someone with technical skills. As 80% of our bookings now come via computer, the filling of this position is essential for our operation.

Raffles Co-Ordinator. Not only do raffles provide us with essential funds, they are very popular with our audiences. For many years now, Helen Greenhill has co-ordinated raffles by acquiring, sorting and wrapping prizes. There must be someone out there with time, energy and creativity who could take on this task or oversee a team. We have ticket sellers and plenty of ticket purchasers, but we NEED the goods to raffle.

Assistant Group Liaison Officer. Robyn Flashman has handled our group bookings for a long time and is now looking to the future. She would like to take on an assistant who would learn the ropes and, in due course, take over the role.



Chimneys

Members of Building Committee have become increasingly aware of the growth of vegetation in both chimneys and particularly of what appears to be a gum tree in the Eric Nicholls chimney and have finally prevailed upon Ipswich City Council to do something about it before a brick is dislodged.

Previous inspections via a drone had at last convinced the Council that ac-



tion might be necessary. On Thursday 7 September a very tall crane, hired by the Council, launched contractors up for close inspection. Temporary strapping has now been placed around the chimney. We await further advice on future action.
