With great sadness, we report that Helen Greenhill passed away on 22 January. Her health has been deteriorating for a number of years so that she could no longer be looked after by her devoted son, Chris. She was moved into a care home, but no sooner had Chris got her established than she suffered renal failure and was placed in palliative care, but only briefly.

Helen had been a member of Committee for a number of years, but her greatest contribution to ILT was the management of our amazingly popular raffles. Through her efforts (and those of her supporters) she was responsible for raising valuable funds and providing great entertainment for patrons during intervals.

In her final report to the AGM, delivered in her absence on the day before she died, she announced proudly, "As you know, I am a Scottish-Jew with short hands and long pockets, and I thrive on making money appear from nowhere. The outlay for 2023 was \$371.00 and the income was \$6,430.00."

Helen will be missed. We offer our condolences to Chris and David and their extended family.
