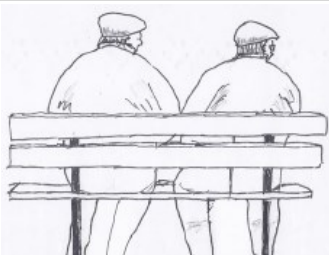

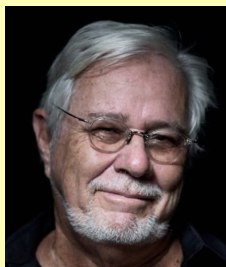

## Redemption comes to the ILT stage in February

Director Shane Mallory, along with Assistant Director Amanda Harrison, Lighting and Sound Designer Phil Holmes and Stage Manager Leanne Bamford, are in the final throes of bringing the iconic 1994 movie, *The Shawshank Redemption*, to life, as a play, on the ILT stage from 25 February to 14 March.

It's not often that a story holds such an enduring place in popular culture as *The Shawshank Redemption*. First penned by Stephen King in his 1982 novel *Rita Hayworth and the Shawshank Redemption*, the tale later became one of the most beloved films of all time. In fact, it tops the list of all-time most popular films on IMDB (Internet Movie Database). Adapted for the stage by Owen O'Neill and Dave Johns, this production by ILT brings a fresh intensity to the story of hope, friendship and survival behind bars.

When banker Andy Du Fresne is sentenced to life imprisonment for a double murder he insists he didn't commit, he finds himself in the grim confines of Shawshank Prison.

There, he forges an unlikely friendship with Red, the prison's "fixer," and begins to find a fragile kind of hope amid the despair. As Andy uses his intelligence and quiet determination to navigate life behind bars, the story unfolds as a powerful meditation on resilience, friendship and the search for redemption.

Even for those who know the film, the stage version offers a more intimate experience. Through Red's narration and the clever use of time and space, we witness the slow burn of Andy's endurance from hopeless newcomer to quiet revolutionary and the impact he has on those around him.

*The Shawshank Redemption* is an emotionally charged piece of theatre that captures both the brutality and beauty of the human spirit. This isn't just a prison drama, it's a story of hope against all odds. It reminds us that even in the darkest of places, hope can still shine through. *The Shawshank Redemption* proves once again that 'hope is a good thing, maybe the best of things.'

Ticket Sales are going so well for this show that ILT have added an additional matinee performance on Saturday, 14 March at 2.00 pm. Don't be disappointed.

Moving on to directing, he directed two one act plays, co-directed two full length plays (with Doug Moses) and a further six full length plays, the latest being *Waiting for God*.

He worked on numerous S-Troupe productions and has assisted with Junior Theatre, Young Theatricals and backstage for a number of Main-house productions. He regularly transported raffle prizes to the Theatre under the direction of his mother.

In February 2018, Josh Nixon resigned as Treasurer because of ill health and Chris was elected to the position which he has held ever since, managing our finances exceedingly well. As a member of the Executive, he has been involved in a number of major decisions.

He joined the Building Committee in 2023. Together with his husband, he took on the role of Director of Junior Theatre and is now director, as of 2026, of the Sparks. He has served on the Productions, Properties and Maintenance Team for at least five years. Anybody seeking evidence of Chris's contribution needs only to look at our grounds which he has meticulously maintained as gardener over the past several years.
