

Everything was in place—we thought. Then came a three day lockdown in answer to an outbreak of COVID-19 (and particularly the highly infectious Delta strain) which meant the set-up working bee couldn't be held as scheduled. We held our breath that restrictions would be lifted enough for us to proceed, but alas, the Executive were faced with the unenviable decision of risking continuation, post-poning or cancelling the Festival for the second year in a row. Inevitably, faced with the impossibility of finding alternative dates, the Executive had to make the sad decision to cancel.



Ipswich Little Theatre was not alone with almost all other Festivals having to be cancelled. This was extremely disappointing for all the groups organising or participating in the events and particularly so for Nanango who were staging their very

first Festival. We have to hope that next year will bring a "new normal" which is a lot closer to the "old normal".



Our next production was well into rehearsals when the lockdown was called. This meant no onstage rehearsals could be held, but Directors Jane Sheppard and Di Johnston minimised the disruption by holding a lines rehearsal via Zoom.

Once the restrictions were eased, the set could be built and rehearsals could recommence.

A Novel Approach to Auditions

The most recent lockdown made the scheduled auditions for *The 39 Steps* on 9 August impossible, so director Shane Mallory took a novel approach to recruitment. He asked each prospective actor to submit a one minute video of a comic performance. These were considered by the production team and our Selection Committee before face-to-face auditions could be held on 16 August.

Vale Beryl Johnston 1929-2021

Sadly, we have to report the passing of Life Member Beryl Johnston who died on her 92^{nd} birthday after a major fall .

Beryl decided in 1955 that she would like to join ILT. Aware of Andy McKenna's involvement, she waited on the footpath to meet him. She certainly threw herself into her new activity, performing in 33 major productions and a dozen one act plays over the next 21 years. She was an excellent actress, winning a number of awards in Festivals. An occasional director, she won the best director award at our Festival in 1969 for *The Faithful*

Widow of Ephesus which was also the play performed at the official opening of the Incinerator Theatre.

Beryl, along with Jean Pratt, helped ILT survive the "dark years" of the 1960s when audiences largely preferred to stay home and watch television. In 1966 she reluctantly agreed to take on the Presidency of the society. Beryl was a dedicated performer and I was privileged to direct her in a number of productions. She retired from the stage far too early (in 1981) and her presence was missed.

Daytime Theatre Troupe

The Covid restrictions have also had a major impact on the Daytimers' production of

The lockdown put a temporary clamp on face to face meetings of the Juniors, but as they had done for much of last year, they took to the air waves again and conducted their sessions via zoom.

Director Deirdre Lowe was determined that the educative process should continue and the children have certainly responded well.

However, they are certainly looking forward to live action again, once the Daytimers season is over and the restrictions are (we hope) lifted for their production of *Things That Go Bump in the Night*..

Young Theatricals

The cancellation of the Festival meant that the youngsters were unable to perform their plays from the *Personal Demons* season.

The uncertainty over future COVID regulations continues to make it difficult to hold lessons and rehearsals. The directors are therefore considering alternative arrangements to keep the students interested and productive. They may be zooming to a solution.

A View of Canberra

Marion Mahony Griffin was a very feisty lady. There is no doubt that her drawings were a major factor in her husband Walter being awarded the prize for the development of Canberra. And her input to his practice was significant if largely unrecognised. Following Walter's death in India she returned to Australia and was noted as a leading Theosophist.

According to a recent article from the Burley Griffin Society, she visited Canberra some time in the 1930s when there had been considerable development. She ex-



pressed the view that there were only two buildings in Canberra that would have had Walter's approval.
